- Born on November 17 1896, in Orsha, Russian empire.
- Died: June 11 1934 at age 37 of tuberculosis.



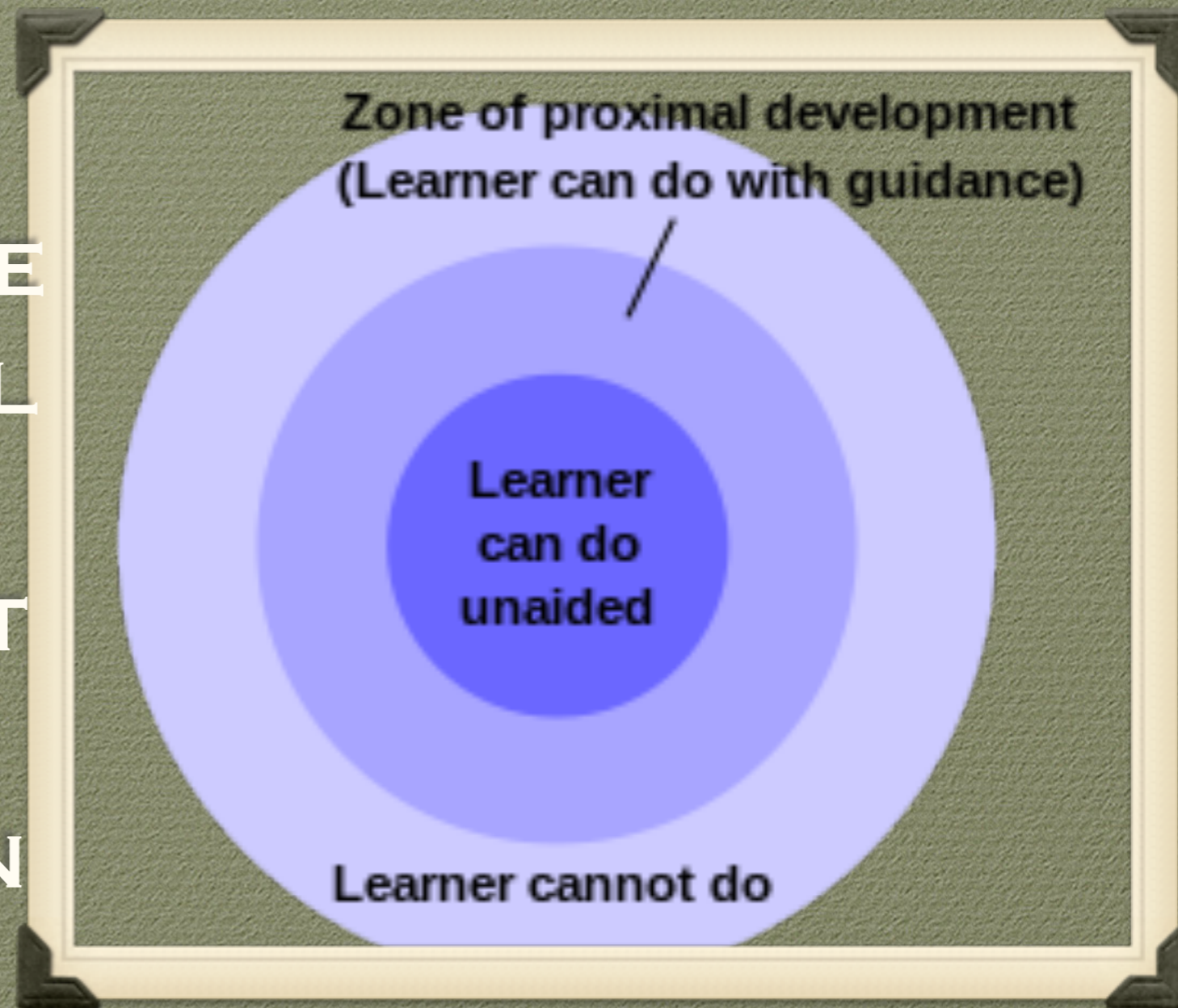
- Lev get admitted to Mascrow State University in 1913 and graduated on 1917.
- There he studied law and in parallel
- early 1920s, he changed his birth name from Vygodskii (with "d") into Vygotskii (with middle "t").
- Vygotskii moved to Moscow with new wife Roza Smekhova then began his career at the Psychological Institute as a "staff scientist



THEORY

- Vygostkii believed that social interaction was needed to develop interlluctual skills.
- He thought that children acquired ways of thinking and behaving by learning from their peers.
- ZPD, is the difference between what a learner can do without help and what he or she can do with help.

APPLICATION

- His theory teaches parents how to teach their kids how to do things without them physically doing it for them.
- Verbal learning can teach the kids not to always rely on their parents and that they can do things themselves.
